A Note From Pastor Lois

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On October 31, the Anniversary of the Reformation will be commemorated around the world; indeed, many events have already begun to commemorate this historic time. As Lutherans, we are taking special notice of the Reformation, in particular of Martin Luther who is hailed as the reformer whose theology we espouse, whose name we take. A first look at the Reformation will focus on music. Other foci will follow in the months leading up to October 31.

Martin Luther held a high esteem for music in worship. His desire in reforming the Church was not to abolish the Mass, but to make it more understandable and accessible to worshippers. He translated the words of the liturgy into German and for the first time, people could hear, understand, and worship, in their native language.

Luther was a musician. He played the flute and the lute, he sang, wrote polyphonic music, chants, liturgical music, and hymns. Among his hymn compositions, either text or tune, there are nineteen in our hymn book ELW including: *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*, and *Lord Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word*. He composed chants for the liturgy including the lessons, Creed, and various parts of the liturgy.

A Note From Pastor Lois contintued

"In the thought and writing of Martin Luther, there clearly are certain themes to which he returns again and again, certain 'paradigms of praise' that helped to shape his understanding of the role of music in the *cultus Dei* and in the total life of the Christian."¹ Music, for Luther, had a prominent role in the praise of God. He believed music should serve God and pointed to the Old Testament writings of the prophets and kings singing praises to God. From the New Testament he cites letters of St. Paul where the new Christians are encouraged to sing spiritual songs and psalms.²

Other paradigms, models, for church music according to Martin Luther include music as God's creation and gift, liturgical song, a sign of continuity with the whole Church. In our time, music retains a strong character of teaching truths about God and the theology of the Church.

Unlike later reformers, Zwingli, Calvin, and others, Luther never abolished the use of instruments in worship, particularly the organ. He encouraged the people to sing and held musicians in high esteem. He believed that singing helped with one's spirit and mood, as well as a means of teaching theology. Luther kept the sung liturgical parts of the Mass and encouraged good music and musicians, especially choirs. Some of his favorite composers of the day were JohannWalter, George Rhau and Josquin des Prez. Luther strongly encouraged of teaching music in the schools to children and in the seminaries.

"I am not satisfied with him who despises music, as all fanatics do; for music is an endowment and a gift of God, not a gift of men. It also drives away the devil and makes people cheerful; one forgets all anger, unchasteness, pride, and other vices. I place music next to theology and give it the highest praise."³

As we think about the time of the Reformation, the Reformers and the Church that continued in faithful worship and praise of the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we are grateful to all who sacrificed their lives, their time, to hand on to us the treasures of this faith. May we continue in our faithfulness to our God, in Christ, as we pass on this faith to the generations who rise and follow us.



14 Red Flags for Elder FINANCIAL Abuse

- 1. Unusual Activity in your bank accounts, including large, frequent or unexplained withdrawals
- 2. Changing from a basic account to one that offers more complicated services that you do does not fully understand or need.
- 3. Withdrawals from bank accounts or transfers between accounts you cannot explain
- 4. A new "best friend" accompanying you to the bank
- 5. Sudden non-sufficient fund activity or unpaid bills
- 6. Closing CDs or accounts without regard to penalties
- 7. Uncharacteristic attempts to wire large sums of money
- 8. Suspicious signatures on checks, or outright forgery
- 9. Confusion, fear or lack of awareness
- 10. Checks written as "loans" or "gifts"
- 11. Bank statements that no longer go to the customer's home
- 12. New powers of attorney the customer does not understand
- 13. A caretaker, relative, or friend who suddenly begins conducting financial transactions on behalf of an older person without proper documentation
- 14. Altered will and trusts
