If anyone wants to walk, they can see Darlis Dyer, Pine Street's coordinator for a registration envelope. If you are interested in raising funds to help fight hunger, here is what you do:

You have to get sponsors (usually you get a flat donation rather than per mile) because the money has to be collected ahead of time and turned in on Walk day. There are certain places that you can designate the money to go (ex: Church World Service is the default) 25% of all money collected stays here in the area and goes to the Food Bank and the Jubilee Kitchen. If you would like to sponsor a walker, please see Darlis also. Darlis plans on walking. The Walk is 10 Kilometers, which is about 6.5 miles.

A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

"Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions."

(Luke 12:15) "So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God". (Luke 12:21)

Unfortunately, we seem to live in an "I want more" society. When we get what we want, we want something more. We never seem to have enough money, food, things. Yet, we in the United States are the most prosperous and well to do people in the history of the world. Our problem as a nation is that we have confused our wants with our needs. Very few of us have everything we "want", but the vast majority of us have more than we "need".

The people of Pine Street Lutheran Church are not your average "I want more" people. We reach out, we share, we support, and we give of our time, talents, skills and treasure in ministry to others. But, are we still fearful of "running out" of money, time, things? As long as we allow fear of deprivation to deter us from sharing fully of our gifts, we will not be "rich toward God". No one expects you to impoverish yourself. All we ask is that you allow your faith and trust in God that He will provide for our needs (not our wants) to free you from fear of investing yourself in God's works. God's mission for us to "share our faith, hope and love through prayer, discipleship, ministry and worship" requires courage and faith. Greed is rooted in fear. Stewardship requires faith and courage. Are we brave enough to trust God to fulfill our needs so that we are free to fully share in God's mission for us? You might find this type of courage to be liberating!



Following the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus the Church made sure to take care of those who were brothers and sisters in Christ. As we read from the book of the Acts of Apostles:

All who believed were together and had all things in common; would sell possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. (Acts 2:44-47)

In order for Pine Street Evangelical Lutheran Church follow the to example set down by the apostles, and in order to care for the members of the Church, we created a fund called the Disciples Fund to care for members of Pine Street Evangelical Lutheran Church who are in need.

The guidelines for use of the fund are as follows:

- 1) Contributions to the fund can be made by anyone through our normal offering process. Gifts that are not anonymous will be accounted for and donors will be given an accounting of their gifts at the end of the year.
- 2) Distributions for the Fund will be under the full discretion of the pastoral staff, and will be confidential for the sake of those receiving help.
- 3)A confidential recording of distributions of the fund will be made in the Disciples Account Record Book for accounting purposes and confidential review.
- 4) The pastoral staff may not use such funds to benefit the pastor or his/her/their family.
- 5)The Disciples Account will be accounted for within the General Fund.

PSELC Year to date Income vs. Expense Summary (Through 8-31-2013):

(The income and expenses summarized here exclude those related to our shared pastoral services arrangement with Trinity Oak Grove, and reflect income and expenses related to the operations of Pine Street Lutheran Church only.)

Total giving to the General Fund is: \$75,757
Total expenses: 75,047
Income vs. expense excess/(deficit) \$710

Our giving has now exceeded our year to date expenses, but our expenses are not uniform each month. To insure we have enough money to cover our budgeted expenses through the end of the year, we need to average \$10,000 per month in giving. We were \$4,953 behind that average through the end of August.

If we continue or slightly increase our present level of financial support, and if we do not encounter any unexpected expenses, we should hopefully end the year with enough funds to allow us to expand ministry activities.

NEW PRESIDING BISHOP

Bishop Elizabeth Easton of Ohio was elected to a 6-year term as Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church America during Churchwide Assembly August. She was elected on the fifth ballot succeeding Bishop Mark Hanson who has served as Presiding Bishop for the last 12 years. Bishop Eaton is married to an Episcopalian priest. She will assume duties on November 1.

Bette first went to Liberia in 1973 and later began service as an ELCA missionary in 1984. She was employed as the secretary to the bishop of the Lutheran Church in Liberia and later served as supervisor of schools of the church. She was responsible for up to 46 schools. Bette was in Liberia during the civil war in 1990. At one point, 600 people, who had taken refuge in St Peter's Lutheran Church in Monrovia, were killed by the armed forces. During this difficult time, Bette endured the same hardships as the Liberian people and supported them through it. Bette retired from mission service in 2011.
