COUNCIL MINUTES

June 17, 2014 Council Minutes approved by Council at the July 15 meeting:

Hospitality: There has been no decision reached re: participation in the September Arts and Crafts festival.

Property: The refrigerator keys will be kept in the kitchen with the other kitchen keys. PPL will pick up the old refrigerators and pay us the trade in reward. The ceiling lights along the front of the church will be fixed by Mike McCarty. The approximate cost of \$1,800 will be paid for by the W/ELCA and a designated memorial contribution. The PA Dept. of Labor and Industry notified us of a deficiency regarding a fire warning sign for the 1-L elevator entrance. Nan has contacted L&I (Dept. of Labor & Industry) and Port Elevator and the sign will be installed by Port Elevator. This is not a critical issue, but a deficiency that is being corrected.

Finance: Treasurers want all committees and Ministries to remember that all requests for reimbursement or bill payment must be submitted on a **Purchase Order** form, with receipts or other documentation or explanation of the purpose of the request attached. Deb will be asked to keep a supply of Purchase Order forms readily available to those that need them.

FACE: Transformational Ministry presented its first draft of a **Guiding Principles** statement before worship on 6/8. Feedback is being received and the statement is being refined. This will be used to expand upon our Mission Statement.

Neighbor's fence: Lois Reabuck has notified us that her fence project

(approved last month) must be put on hold until she has a new roof put on her house. She is asking for permission to have a dumpster placed on our lawn at her patio line to collect the debris from the roof. This should only take a few days. Council approved this request . A letter will be sent to Lois with the additional caution that there is a sewer line where the dumpster will be placed and that her contractor will need to take precautions to protect that line.

Hoagie Sales beneficiaries: It was requested to consider adding our church sponsored Boy Scout and Cub Scout groups to the list of community organizations that benefit from our ongoing hoagie sales. This recommendation was accepted enthusiastically by Nan Leighow, coordinator of the hoagie sales.

The followings is a <u>DRAFT</u> of recent Council meeting of July 15, 2014. These minutes won't be officially approved until the September Council Meeting.

Treasurers-made note that year-todate we are behind in attendance and giving.

Hospitality-(Alf Bashore and Mary Ann Landi) have decided they will coordinate the comfort station at this year's Fall Arts and Crafts Festival. The Boy Scout troop will be asked to participate.

Finance-an internal audit is being organized. Members who are to be reimbursed are reminded to fill out a Purchase Order (in the black rack next to the treasurer's folder in the office).

Caring-Stephen's Ministry,
Transformation Ministry and home
communions are all going well with
more Stephen's Ministry classes to
come. Jubilee Kitchen will be
September 20.

Pastor's Report-VBS went very well.
We are looking forward to
continuing our relationship with
Trinity Lutheran, Danville, whose
new pastor, Rev. Trevor Hahn, will
begin on August 1.

Request-A request has been approved for a May 2015 wedding to be held at our church due to location and size of their church.

Festival Proceeds-will be divided 50/50 to Restoration and Danville Area School Districts Helping

Hands program. Members of our church will be asked to contribute or solicit gift baskets for the Festival's Chinese auction.

Pictorial Directory-Darlis Dyer will begin the process of a new directory in the spring of 2015. Trinity Oak Grove will be asked to join us for a joint directory, with separate sections for each church.
