David's Prayer

In 1 Chronicles 29 we read a prayer of thanksgiving offered by David. In verse 14 David asks "But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to make this free will offering? For all things come from you, and of your own we have given." David is expressing a sense of inadequacy in offering gifts **to** God by acknowledging that all such gifts actually come **from** God. David realizes that he is privileged to be a vessel that acknowledges God's abundance by returning God's gift to God. It is always easier to part with something that really didn't belong to us to begin with. Think of this as the earliest form of **regifting**. But, the payback is infinitely larger for us, for our church and for our God, as we spend these gifts to worship and praise Him through prayer, discipleship and ministry.



Financial Status of the Restoration Project:

(as of *December 31, 2014*)

Total cost of the exterior restoration project: \$78,643

Donations received in December: \$ 339 from hoagie sales
545 from giving

\$ 884 total

Total on hand: \$ 4,782

Loan balance: \$26,731

Through the combined income from hoagie sales, member contributions, and fundraisers, we were able to reduce our loan balance from \$35,944 to \$26,731 in 2014, a total of \$9,213. This was a ten year loan. We should have it repaid in less than six.

The cost is \$4 for regular; \$5 for Tuna (90% of the proceeds goes to our Restoration Project and 10% goes to a charity or community project).

Many dedicated volunteers supported the Hoagie sales in 2014. Without their love and concern for the church and community this would not be possible. Since 2011 we are proud that this project has contributed \$15,000.00 to the restoration of the church building and over \$1,900.00 to various community charities.

### **TRANSFORMATIONAL MINISTRY**

#### **Our Purpose Statement:**

God's mission and our purpose for Pine Street Lutheran Church is to share our faith, hope and love through prayer discipleship, ministry and worship.

#### **Guiding principles:**

1. We pray daily for guidance and discernment of God's will for us.
2. With guidance from the Holy Spirit, we study the Bible and proclaim the Good News in our church, community and world.
3. Trusting God, we serve all people following the example of Jesus.
4. We gather as one body in Christ to proclaim our faith, glorify God, and be filled with God's Holy Spirit.

## **Pastor Keith's Availability**

- I'm generally in the office on Monday (following choir-11 AM to 1 PM sometimes until 4 PM or so), Wednesday (10:30 AM until 2 PM sometimes 3 PM), Thursday (10 AM to 3 PM [with Bible Study from 1:30 PM to 2:30 PM]). These times are tentative depending whether I have been called out or have an evening meeting either here or at Trinity Oak Grove, or possibly worship at one of 3 or so nursing homes.
- I work from home on Tuesdays after Breakfast and Bible Text Study (Pericope) with colleagues. Due to the need to have this flexibility, I would suggest calling me to arrange an appointment. My number is 570-951-2350. Please feel free to call me for pastoral care needs, emergencies or if you just need to talk. I would rather hear about a need or situation 5 times (or more) than to not hear about it at all. I would be glad to meet in my office at the church, in your home, or at a local eatery or gathering place. Just let me know. The days and/or times are not limited to those specified above.
- If you ask or tell me something before worship or at fellowship on Sunday, (especially if it involves something I need to do or someone I need to go see) please follow up with a phone call, text or email on Sunday evening or Monday. It takes a bunch of brain cells to prepare for worship and to mingle, network, "converse and console"—(Luther's terms) and sometimes there are not enough brain cells to go around . . . a friendly reminder would be greatly appreciated. ([prkeith@ptd.net](mailto:prkeith@ptd.net)) If you are (or are going to be) or you know of someone in (or going into) the hospital, please call and let me know.

## **IN CASE OF FIRE!!!**

One of the first things we learn about fire safety in elementary school is to keep all doors closed to keep a fire from spreading from one room to another.

Last Monday when I came in to the office and then over to the church to collect bulletins, there were SIX doors either left open or propped open and not closed. One of them was one of the blue fire doors inside the back door. These doors are to be kept closed at all times in case of a fire so the stairs can be used for a fire escape.

ALSO, there are numerous heat zones that heat these buildings—it's not just one unit. The social Hall is one; the sanctuary is one; the elevator annex up and down is one; the office side downstairs in the Luther House is one; the upstairs on the floor of the nursery and chapel is one, the other side of the Luther House is one; plus the upstairs and attic on that side are others. These doors need to be kept closed at all times. If not, one section is trying to heat another section.

Please be vigilant, especially our Ushers and Elevator Annex Ushers/Greeters, to keep these doors closed.

And thank you to all who do close these doors. It is very important for fire safety and for saving on heating costs. Thank you.
