#### September, 2015

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ;

I write this as I begin ministry full time with you. Even though I have been with you since July 1, I was not full time, now I am. Most of the weeks, I will be in the office on Monday and Wednesday mornings, and in and out other times. Thursdays are my sermon preparation and study time. This time will be spent in my home office to keep the time sacred and uninterrupted. Please feel free to stop in to see me during regularly scheduled hours, or, schedule a time with me if these hours do not work for you.

As we begin the Autumn season, we think of cooler temps, football, the Danville festival, the turning of foliage, and fewer hours of daylight. We move from the activities of summer into different activities of the autumn. We will resume reading from the gospel of Mark on Sunday mornings and notice the action and movement of Jesus and his disciples.

The gospel readings from the Lectionary beginning in September and continuing for ten weeks are from the gospel of Mark, chapters 7 through 10. I recommend reading this as one unit. In your prayer and Bible reading time, take time to read this through in one sitting, it isn't really very long, and there is a different feel to the text as it is read inclusively.

Years ago, I began a clergy retreat in Ohio on the gospel of Mark. We initialized our time together by reading the entire gospel of Mark after dinner the first night. We were amazed at how we learned new insights even though all of us had been preaching from Mark and reading it for years. In these chapters, 7 through 10, Jesus is on the move with his disciples, teaching, healing, leading them to learn and grow with spiritual insight. Yet, it was difficult and slow for them, they did not fully grasp all he was saying and doing. It was not until after the death and resurrection of Jesus, that they understood him truly, as the Christ.

Life lived from our baptismal covenant can be slow for us to understand completely as well, not always fully comprehending what it means to follow Jesus the Christ. The good news for us is, of course, that Jesus does not give up on us, just as he did not give up on the disciples. So, we begin again and again to wrestle with the scriptures, to find solace, comfort, encouragement, challenges.

In this Newsletter, I pray you will find good news, sources for encouragement, and areas where you are needed. I pray that together, we will find that walking with Christ, daily, will bring rewards and joys, even as we too continue to have movement with Christ, supported and sustained by his Holy Word and Sacrament. May you be blessed in your journey and may it be profound in your life.
