A Note From Pastor Martin

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ;

Advent is upon us, are we prepared for this season of preparation? First, we will feast on the food on the holiday of Thanksgiving, then some will shop, some will go deer hunting, and some will begin preparing for Christmas. Some will climb up to the attic or down to the basement, and pull out the decorations of the season, trees, lights, blown-up Santas, reindeer, snowmen and other assorted characters. How will we ever find the time to do all that is expected of us in these four weeks? How will we find the resources of energy, money, and still look like the cozy pictures of contentment that appear on some the Christmas cards?

The preparations are many as we begin this 'holiday season'. There are frantic rushes to prepare for special meals, parties, purchasing of gifts, wrapping them just right, and then, for some, coordinating family schedules and making travel plans so that those on the list get to be visited, their decorations and tree seen with

complimentary 'oohs and aahs.', and asking sure that 'family time' gets into the schedule. The truth is that for some, family tensions will increase, feelings get hurt, loved ones who have died will be missed, loneliness and depression will set in, and the pressure to give what is expected will stress already strained finances.

And, in addition, but primarily, we have entered the holy season of Advent. Advent means 'to come' or 'coming'. What does the church have in mind by setting this season apart while the rest of the world celebrates Christmas now? For that matter, what does God have in mind for the church, for God's people, during this season when we prepare to receive, as for the first time, the Incarnation of our God?

With all of these preparations, it seems impossible to accomplish our tasks. Alone, we cannot do it. The Word of God reminds us that what we are really preparing for is no less than the coming of our God, in human form, the Word made flesh. We find comfort from the prophets who gave the message about the coming of the Messiah. Readings from Scripture remind us that God was also preparing the world for the coming of the Messiah through the prophets and in the Psalms.

The matter of most importance is watching for God's activity in our daily activity, God's love, God's grace, God's faithfulness. We are called to sharpen our awareness and maintain

a prayerful life as we watch and wait for the coming of the Christ. The Old Testament scripture for the four Sundays of Advent come the book of Isaiah. Repentance and hope characterize the gospel readings for this season. As we begin our preparations, enjoy our parties and the musical and drama events of the season, let us not forget that the Incarnation, the birth of Jesus, was the in-breaking of the Kingdom of God into the world. Let us not forget that our salvation began with the decision of God and the coming of God in the flesh.

Prepare the way of the Lord, rejoice, for the Word was made flesh and dwells among us. These words of the gospel on Christmas are good news, words of hope and joy. May you and your loved ones enjoy and delight in this season of busyness and preparation, of repentance and forgiveness, of good will and peace. May the

Christ dwell in your heart and bring you peace,

On Reformation Sunday evening at 5:30,

Pine Street Confirmation Class welcomed the Confirmation Classes from Trinity Lutheran Church, Danville, and St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Danville. The three classes met in the Fellowship Hall and were fed a light meal by the Hospitality Ministry. The group gathered to begin to learn about each other as we study our churches and grow in our spiritual and faith formation during the time of Confirmation. In recognition of the Commemoration of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation in 2017, questions were asked of the group regarding what we know

about each other, what we study, how we are alike and different. A lively discussion grew from the questions. The group expressed interest in doing more events together.

At the end of the meeting, three lists of thirty-two points of agreement (from the document Declaration on the Way: Church, Ministry and Eucharist), between the Roman Catholic Church and the Lutheran Church were taken to each church. Because of the rain, they would not be posted on the church doors as originally planned. These points signify new agreements between the Churches.

I have only been in the office a few short weeks, yet I have gotten a good understanding of how your church office is run and how a Lutheran worship service is put together. More importantly, I have learned how the people of your congregation come together for each other every single day. It has been awe-inspiring and heartwarming to see how you all work together to hold each other up on a daily basis. 
