WAS ELECTED THE THIRD BISHOP OF THE UPPER SUSQUEHANNA SYNOD ON SATURDAY, JUNE 18 AT SYNOD ASSEMBLY. SELINSGROVE.

BISHOP-ELECT COLLINS WILL BEGIN HER DUTIES AS BISHOP ON SEPTEMBER 1. AND WILL BE OFFICIALLY INSTALLED ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29 BY PRESIDING BISHOP ELIZABETH ETON IN ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH, SUNBURY.

BISHOP ROBERT DRIESEN WILL FINISH SERVING AS BISHOP ON AUGUST 31. HE WILL REMAIN IN OFFICE UNTIL THAT DATE AND HELP IN THE TRANSITION OF THE OFFICE OF BISHOP.

A CELEBRATION OF HIS MINISTRY WILL BE HELD ON JULY 16 AT MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH IN SOUTH WILLIASPORT. ALL ARE INVITED TO ATTEND BOTH CHURCH CELEBRATIONS.

#### July, 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

We have entered the 'green' time of the Church Year. The paraments and the pastor's stole are green, we sometimes refer to these colors as 'the color of the day'. The green color signifies 'growth', and indeed for us in the Northern Hemisphere, it is a time when creation bursts with growth.

But the reference to growth and the color green come from the texts we read during this time after Pentecost, from Trinity Sunday until the first Sunday of Advent. The texts which are read on Sunday mornings speak to our growth in Christ, our growth as his disciples living our calling to ministry.

The accent on this, the second half of the church year, has to do with how we respond to Christ. What do we do with our lives because of his birth, his calling of disciples, working of miracles, healing, teaching, preaching and finally the giving of his body and blood, his death on the cross, his resurrection, ascension and sending of the Holy Spirit. What do we do in response to all that?

During this 'green' time, we are called to grow, to deepen our faith and our faithfulness. This is the time for preparing for the Church Festival, the time for planning Confirmation Class and Youth Group in the Fall, this is the time for picnics, for relaxation, for renewal.

We, in the Upper Susquehanna Synod, have just elected a new bishop, the third bishop of this Synod. This country will elect a new President in November, and at the nominating conventions this summer, there will be a greater emphasis on political speeches and promises. This summer, there is much to ponder, much to pray about, in our church life, and in our country's life. The important point to remember is that we live together, and for us, the particular ways we live out those promises given to us by Christ.

The rich growth of crops, fruits, vegetables, the lush growth of the church community garden, remind us also of the Tree of Life, the rich growth of our lives in Christ, and the family of God in which we gather each week, joined with the Church Triumphant.

We give thanks to God in Christ Jesus who gives us this life, who continues to call us and watch over our growth. May we use this time, this 'green time of growth' to be refreshed, renewed. May we blossom and bloom to be all that God has called us to be, as we are nurtured by his holy Word, and the Sacrament of his life.

#### A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

#### **Monthly Financial Stewardship report for May 2016**

In 2016 we need to *average* **\$2,679** per week in giving to assure that we are able to meet all of our budgeted expenses. Our expense budget is something that we adopted and <u>committed</u> to.

Our weekly total church attendance during May was 270. (avg 68/week)) Our total giving to the General Fund totaled \$8,780 an average of \$2,195 per week.

Year to date we are **\$10,296 behind** in the giving that is needed to meet our budgeted expenses.
