Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I write to you hearing the gospel of Luke for the fourteenth Sunday of Pentecost still in my head and in my heart. The woman was in the presence of Jesus, among the crowd, she was bent over, she had been bent over for eighteen years. The text tells us that it was a spirit that kept her bent over. Was she depressed, was she so weak that she could not stand straight, had she been so shamed that she could not look in people's faces anymore, was she so lonely, or poor, or oppressed, or in pain, that she did not want to engage in life?

We don't know what caused her to be so bent over. We do know that she did not seek Jesus for healing, she did not ask it from him. He saw her, he called to her, and simply said to her, 'Woman, you are set free from your ailment.' (Luke 13. 12) But those who were at the scene did not give acclamation to Jesus, or rejoice with the woman, they only criticized Jesus because, it was the Sabbath. He cured her on the Sabbath!

I have noticed that the long protracted political campaign and its endless criticism, the manner in which candidates speak about each other and the situations we face, seems to be taking a toll on the spirits of people. There seems to be only a contest, and that is about who will win, it doesn't seem to be about healing, about unbinding, about grace, although those words are occasionally hinted. And, in this long summer drought and heat, the flowers and shrubs, even the trees, seem to be leaning down, the heavy weight of their foliage and flowers without water taking a toll on their beauty, perhaps even their life.

The Word of Life, Jesus the Messiah, came to the woman, nameless though she remains, and he offered her hope, healing, life. He unbound her. Only the critics noticed, and they had a different agenda. My thought dwell with this anonymous woman, the gift she was given. My heart rejoices with her, with all who are given hope and new life, with all who are unbound and set free by that which binds them and keeps them from seeing the beauty of each day, from seeing sunsets and sunrises, the moon through the fog before daybreak, the smile on the face of a beloved that never changes.

Jesus brings us freedom, it is up to us to enjoy it, it is our decision to make known that which has been given to us. The critics will always be among us, the nay-sayers will always be on the look-out for something to keep others in oppression and confusion, but, thanks be to God, we have been watered with life-giving water of Baptism, and nourished with the Cup of Salvation, we have been blessed with life. Bless the Lord, O my Soul, and Praise His Holy Name!

Monthly Financial Stewardship report for July 2016

In 2016 we need to *average* **\$2,679** per week in giving to assure that we are able to meet all of our budgeted expenses. Our expense budget is something that we adopted and <u>committed</u> to.

Our weekly total church attendance during June was 253. (average 51/week)) Our gifts to the General Fund totaled \$10,956 an average of **\$2,191** per week.

Year to date we are **\$16,744 behind** in the giving that is needed to meet our budgeted expenses.
