A Time of Transition

When I signed the agreement to serve as Interim Pastor of Pine Street in August 2017, the termination date of my serving as interim pastor was 30. September 2018. For the past few months, I have been wrestling with whether or not to extend that term. Before I had reached a decision, the flood of 13. August occurred and as I noted in last month's newsletter, my house was severely impacted. This was the third time I was flooded since I moved into the house in January 1996. I cannot do it again. Therefore, I have made the decision to find a new place to live (far away from any water!). Since 13. August, I have been cleaning up, looking for a new house, and finding someone to buy my property. That means that the next few months (hopefully) will be consumed with finding a house, closing, preparing to move and finally moving. I think that I will be too consumed by all of that to effective continue to serve as your interim pastor. Therefore, I will complete my time as Interim Pastor of Pine Street on 31. October 2018.

I have been in conversation with Bishop Collins, and I think we have a good plan in mind. We are suggesting that the Rev. Gretchen Johannsen become the interim pastor for Pine Street. Pr. Johannsen is currently serving as Interim Pastor and stated supply for Trinity, Oak Grove, and is willing to add Pine Street to her duties. She will also become the stated supply for Pine Street. That means that the same pastor will be at Pine

Street every Sunday. The Congregation Council of Pine Street will formally approve this arrangement on 2. October 2018.

Bishop Collins and I (in my role as Dean of the North Branch Conference) feel that this could possibly lead to a re-linking of Pine Street and Trinity, Oak Grove.

I thank all of you for your support and caring over the past twelve months. It has been a joy to work with you over the past year. I think we have made good progress on working out most of the "problems" and are well on the road to moving forward. I see good things coming your way.

As I told the council, I wasn't quite prepared to

come to like you all so much. But I did! It has been an enjoyable year for me, and I hope for all of you, too. You have been so very gracious, caring and loving to me in our time together, and I thank you for that. Most of all, I thank God for all of you.

Since I am Dean for this conference, I will continue to be involved in the call process, which will hopefully lead to calling a pastor. So, you may see me popping in and out now and then.

Again, thank you for your love and support. Know that this congregation will continue to be in my prayers as you continue to move forward.

From the Archives...

A History of Pine Street Lutheran Church

A supply pastor, the Rev. D. B. Floyd, filled in until the Rev. J.H. Musselman was installed on November 1, 1909. During his service a great deal was done for the church property. In 1914, the church was completely remodeled and repainted, the high steeple was removed, the interior was frescoed, a number of memorial windows were installed, a new Moeller pipe organ was purchased, and electric lighting system was adopted, and a hard wood floor was the carpets, which were dispensed and unsanitary. All done at a cost of more than \$7,000 and by 1919, the congregation was debt free. Sometime previous to this remodeling, the balcony in the nave was removed.

In the <u>Historical and Biographical Annals of Columbia and Montour Counties</u> there appears a list of the church officers in 1914. Many of these men may be traced back to German-speaking families who emigrated from Europe to the Danville area in the early and middle years of the 19th century. Some of these family names such as Divel, Jacobs, Farley, Schoch, Werkheiser, Sidler, and Eyerly have remained prominent up into recent years.

From September 16, 1919 to May 7, 1922 the congregation was served by the Rev. David Burnite. On July 3D, 1922, the Rev. Walter E. Brown began a 32 ministry, which lasted until December 3D, 1954. The church was solidly established during these years it maintained a strong Christian witness to God's word. However, troubles plagued the church building during these years as it was twice struck by lightning and was once damaged by hurricane winds. Lightning struck on May 18, 1943 causing a major fire, which gutted the church tower, the belfry, and the second floor nave and sanctuary. As a result, it was necessary to remodel and redecorate the church, keeping damaged sections closed for the better part of two years. The chancel area was redesigned with a deeper sanctuary, antiphonal choir lofts were built, high chancel arches and pilasters formed the front of the church, a new pulpit was erected, a new alter was constructed and the lecterns and baptismal font were replaced. Behind the chancel area, a choir room and a sacristy were built. A new cold-cathode indirect lighting was installed in the cove area around the ceiling of the nave, the floor was tiled and the painting was redone in ivory with walnut trim. Total cost of this extensive project was approximately \$20,000. A week of services from September 29 to October 6, 1946 marked the rededication of this house of worship.
