A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

"Accept, O Lord, the gifts we bring to place upon your table. We do not worship as we ought but only as we're able".

This is the familiar refrain from the offertory hymn contained in our Of the Lands and Seasons liturgy. In this we recognize that no matter how hard we try, we can never adequately repay our God for the many gifts he has bestowed upon us. The gifts of life, family, friends, love, shelter, food, work, enjoyment, worship, and the list could go on and on. We worship with our gifts in return as we are able, not as we ought.

Would any of us worship to the extreme that Jesus worshipped when he made the ultimate sacrifice of his earthly life, so that we might be blessed with God's salvation through grace? Any gift we give pales in comparison. But, when we give of our time, talent, ability and treasures to worship and thank God, we should do so out of love and gratitude for His gifts to us, not out of obligation.
