The Widow's Mite

As Jesus looked up, he saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. 2 He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. 3 "Truly I tell you," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. 4 All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on." Luke 21:1-4

This message was so important to God, that he placed it in two different gospels of his living word. The two small copper coins were called mites. Two bronze mites, known as a Leptons, meaning small, are together, worth a quadrans, the smallest Roman coin. A lepton was the smallest, and least valuable coin in circulation in Palestine. At the time, it was worth the equivalent of six minutes of the average daily wage. It's safe to say the coins were two half-pennies.

At the temple of Jerusalem, the wealthy dropped large, heavy coins, very valuable, into the donation box. They made a loud noise when they landed in the box, calling attention to their donation. When the poor widow dropped her two half-pennies in, they probably made no sound.

During my time with you at Pine Street, some of you have lamented that you wish you could increase your tithes. Some of you have shared with me how you are embarrassed by your "small" gifts. I want you to know that God rejoices at your gift, no matter how small! He knows your heart, and your situation, and he rejoices at your faith! Never be ashamed of any gift! Rejoice!

This is so close to me, for this is where I live spiritually. I have often witnessed a visitor give his last dollar to the Lord. You bring a dollar store pack of cookies to fellowship, that's a mite, Rejoice! You give a jar of peanut butter to the food bank basket, that's a mite, Rejoice! A pan of mac and cheese for fellowship, that's a mite, Rejoice! You bring bread for communion, that's a mite, Rejoice! You have monetary wealth, and freely give to the Lord, Rejoice!

The widow's mite was equal to six minutes of labor. Short on money, but Love the Lord? Visit a shut-in, that's a mite, Rejoice! Hug someone who's having a rough time, that's a mite, Rejoice! Send a sympathy card with a Love message, that's a mite, Rejoice!

Love someone you don't like, that's a mite, Rejoice! Call someone in crisis or in mourning, that's a mite, Rejoice! Give six minutes a day/week/month to the service of the Lord, that's a mite, Rejoice! Call Deb, and volunteer to serve during worship service, that's a mite, Rejoice!

I love to encounter people's mites at the church. They mostly make no sound when they are given, but they make an impact every time. I want you to feel free to share the story of your mite with Pastor, me, and your church family. Together with you and the Lord, we will rejoice with you!

A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

"Who will give himself and all that he has to the Lord?" (1 Chronicles 29:5)

This verse from the Old Testament sounds like a very large and quite unreasonable request. If the leadership at Pine Street were to come to you with the expectation that you should give all that you have to your church to do God's work, I am sure that our membership roles would dwindle guickly and Sunday attendance at church would become guite sparse. But, this chapter of the Bible refers to David's efforts to raise money to erect the Jew's first temple to God. And, David himself set the example for generosity by using "every resource at my command" (v.2) and "all of my own private treasures to aid in the construction" (v.3).Through his example, others were motivated to likewise perhaps sacrifice, not extensively as David, but enough to make a difference and finally see God's house completed.

Too often, we look upon the financial needs of the church from a business point of view. We adopt a budget, we do our best to give enough to meet that budget, and hope that others also "do their part". But, David's example shows us that giving should be regarded as a spiritual activity. It is part of our act of worship, not just a monetary exchange. Through financial stewardship we are not invited to give only of our material possessions, but rather to give of ourselves wholly to the Lord. Giving in response to will obligation always be limited. Giving as an act of prayer and worship allows us to grow in our devotion to God. Anything given that surpasses our own church's needs is then turned into a ministry of love to others, in our community, our

Synod, and our worldwide church body. It supports missions, ministries to the poor and disadvantaged, food for the hungry, warmth from the cold, and many other outreach activities.

"Who then will offer willingly, consecrating themselves today to the Lord?" (v.5) Generosity of time, talent, ability and treasure will bring us closer to God. It works. Trust me.

Why and how do we use ashes on Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday is the Wednesday of the seventh week before Easter and the first day of Lent. The day is named for the practice of imposing ashes, a practice which many Lutheran congregations have found to be a very meaningful part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy. Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The early Christians adopted the use of ashes from Jewish practice as an external mark of penitence. Ashes symbolize several

aspects of our human existence:

- · Ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin, as God said to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).
- · Ashes suggest cleansing and renewal. They were used anciently in the absence of soap. On Ash Wednesday ashes are a penitential substitute for water as a reminder of our baptism.
- · Ashes remind us of the shortness of human life, for it is said as we are buried: "earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust."
- Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

In the Ash Wednesday liturgy from Evangelical Lutheran Worship, pages 251-255, the confession and imposition of ashes follow the proclamation of the Word of God in biblical readings, sermon, and song. This confession marks the beginning of a season of penitence. The Maundy Thursday absolution is the structural response to the Ash Wednesday confession, marking off Lent as a penitential time. At the conclusion of the Ash Wednesday confession and imposition of ashes, a declaration of grace is used, coupled with a plea for mercy.
