Prayer

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

My surgery had been scheduled months ago. The days drug on for three months then the day finally arrived. That day was yesterday. In the week leading up to yesterday, I gathered all the concentrated Prayer support I could. I even asked all my customers, some of whom are unchurched or unbelievers. I asked them to Pray for me. Some said they would be thinking about me. What better way to get an unbeliever to talk to God by asking them to Pray for you.

I activated the church Prayer chain. I activated my personal internet Prayer chain of fellow believers not in our church. I asked for, and received laying on of hands with Prayer. I was confident that I had God's blessing going into the hospital.

All previous surgeries for me took place at the Bloomsburg Hospital. The O.R. staff all know me. I am comfortable there. This surgery was at another hospital. I knew no one there. The butterflies buzzed in my stomach the morning of the surgery. I was confident in my faith, yet my human side was nervous. I could not receive any preoperative drugs to relax me as the surgeon had to mark my leg just before the surgery.

When they wheeled me into that operating room I was as wide awake as you are now. As I slid over onto the operating table, I realized that no one could help me now. As I looked up into the huge operating room light above me, one thought was in my mind. "It's just you and me Lord." I began to feel so alone and scared. I began to plead in my mind "save me Lord, save me Lord!" Everything went black. I awoke two hours later in the recovery room. An hour later I left the hospital. I was home in thirty more minutes. I am well ahead of the curve on healing with virtually no pain.

Sooner or later you are going to run into a situation in your life where it's just going to be you and the Lord. Open the lines of communication now with the Lord. Pray unceasingly, and with joy in all circumstances. Bear your burdens with us and with God. Never face any trying circumstance without all the concentrated Prayer support you can muster.

It's alright to be afraid, the Lord is always with you. Always. I still face two additional surgeries to cure my ill. I will be calling upon you and the Lord to Pray for me and with me. I know I can count on both of you.

And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:20

PSELC Year to date Income vs. Expense Summary (Through 4-30-2013):

(The income and expenses summarized here exclude those related to our shared pastoral services arrangement with Trinity Oak Grove, and reflect income and expenses related to the operations of Pine Street Lutheran Church only.)

Total giving to the General Fund is:	\$41,345
Total expenses:	<u>45,349</u>
Excess/ (deficit)	\$ (4,004)

In the first 33% of the year we have spent 38% of our budget. Most of the excess expenses are related to heating costs for the winter. This deficit will be reduced when we enter the warmer months.

A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

Stewardship: giving or receiving?

"The rich man is not the one who is in possession of much, but one who gives much." (St. John Crystostom)

When the subject of stewardship arises, most of us ask "How much is this going to cost me?" But, have we ever considered how much we receive on a day to day basis and where it all comes from? Sometimes we honestly feel and believe that everything we have is due to our own sweat and efforts, but just to be "good with God" we give Him quick thanks anyway. But nothing that we have accomplished would have been possible without the talents and abilities we received from God, a gift that is given freely.

Have we ever considered how much of a barrier material possessions create between each of us and God? Jesus, in thirteen of his nineteen parables, directly addressed the topic of the right and wrong use of our possessions. Why then do we continue to debate the question of "how much", when the issue of making sacrifices to our church arises? Why do we feel such loyalty and allegiance to our material possessions? What is the connection between our Lord and money in our lives? In 1 Chronicles 29, David proclaims "Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor and everything in heaven and earth is yours....Wealth and honor come from you; you are the ruler of all things."

Because God is so generous to us, shouldn't we be generous to him in return with the gifts of our time, talent, abilities and treasure? David certainly understood. Jesus understood. Can we understand?

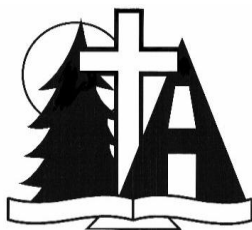

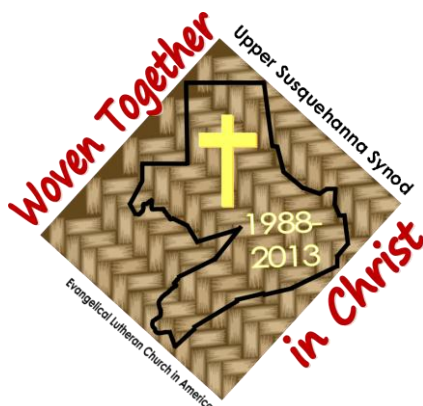

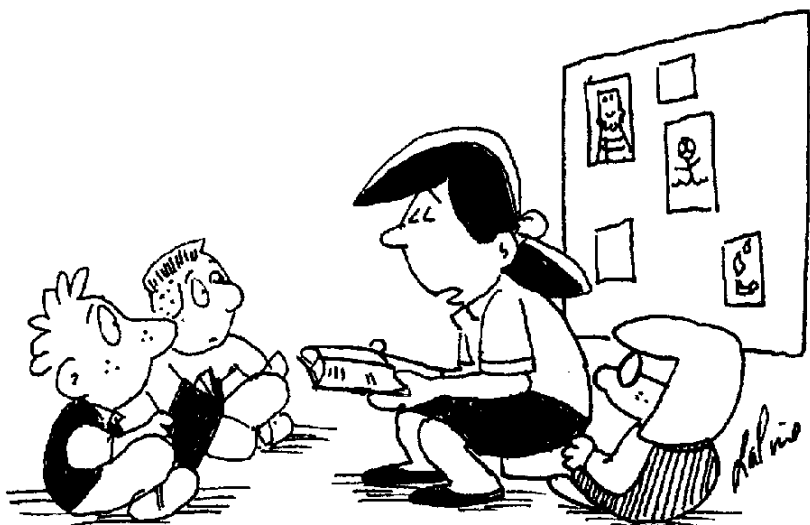
