I don't need to go to church! By Larry Troy

"I can worship God alone. I worship God in the wilderness. The mountains are my church. I worship in solitude. I don't want to be with a bunch of hypocrites." A sister in Christ arrived for Sunday School. She was crying. There had been a tragic automobile accident, resulting in a death the day before. This sister was withdrawn and quiet during our Sunday School class. After the class, we discussed what we could do to help. We started by offering the laying-on of hands Prayer and Blessing to her. She accepted.

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." Galatians 6:2

After worship services, in the fellowship hall, we announced what had happened, and appealed to the church family to come forward to participate. Every man, woman, and child in the room came forward. At this hour of darkness, this grieving sister in Christ was swarmed by her church family in Love, sympathy, and grief. Each of us bearing her burden, small children included.

During the meal and fellowship time that followed, our sister received many hugs and offers of sympathy. We can't stop tragedies from occurring. We <u>can</u> walk with God and you through them when they occur. That's why we need to be in church. The mountains won't hug you when you hurt. The streams won't wipe away your tears. God and your church family will. We come to church because that's what God wants us to do. We are to be in community with other believers, to carry out the Great Commission, to Minister and Love in Jesus' name.

Today, standing connected with my church family, bearing another's burden, Loving everyone, in Prayer to my savior, I knew I was where God wants me to be: 407 Pine Street.

PSELC Year to date Income vs. Expense Summary (Through 5/31-2013):

(The income and expenses summarized here exclude those related to our shared pastoral services arrangement with Trinity Oak Grove, and reflect income and expenses related to the operations of Pine Street Lutheran Church only.)

Total giving to the General Fund is: \$49,249 Total expenses: 56,023 Income vs. expense excess/ (deficit) \$ (6,774)

With 42% of the year over, we have spent 48% of our budget. This simply means that our expenses were higher than average in the early part of the year. Most of the excess expenses are related to heating costs for the winter. This deficit should be reduced when we enter the warmer months. If we continue or slightly increase our present level of financial support, and if we do not encounter any unexpected expenses, we should be fine by the end of the year.

A STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

Giving an irreplaceable asset

Invariably, the first thing that comes to mind when we speak of stewardship and giving to the church, is money. is usually That followed by feelings of guilt ("I give what I can, but I know it isn't enough."), fear ("If I give it to the church, I might not have enough for own needs."), resentment (Why is the church always after money. Let someone who is better off than me handle the deficit!"), anger (Darn church, all they really want is my money!"), or any a myriad other of emotions, most of which are negative. While money matters, it is not the true essence of stewardship, nor is it the most valuable thing you can give.

Stewardship can be discussed in terms of talent, ability, time and treasure. We give, hopefully freely and gratefully, to preserve and improve a spiritual asset that we all enjoy now, for those who will follow us. In money, general, when spent, is replaced by new income later. When given to the church, our treasures are returned to magnified by God's grace. Talent and ability we will always have, no matter how much we use it. In fact, the more we use our talents and abilities. the finer they become.

Time is the one gift that when given, we can never get back. A moment passes by and is then gone forever. How generous it is, then, when we choose to spend our time in serving our

church and in serving others in God's name (the definition of ministry).

When we speak "giving" to the church, let us never minimize the value of our time. There are many ways to contribute to the church spending nothing but time. You can join a ministry or committee, or be a willing nominee for Council. You can consider volunteering as a helper for Vacation Bible School, for Sunday school, as a church service participant, for work in the office, to help clean-up after Sunday fellowship. You could make a dish fellowship, Sunday carry communion to a shut in, help in one of our gardens, make ice cream or hoagies, or help at a dinner fund raiser. You can invite a newcomer to come church with you, and carry Christ's message of peace and love in all that you do. The possible uses of your time as a gift to your church are as endless as the limits of your imagination.

I have found that the time I have spent doing work for the church always turns into a precious asset. The interactions with others, the satisfaction of doing something constructive, the warmth that comes from doing good works of service, all have enriched my time. Even though I can never retrieve the time I have spent, I know that I will never lose the gifts I have received because I gave of that time. Do you want to be good steward? Don't forget the value of your time. If you're not sure what to do, just ask. If you're asked to help, just say

"yes". If you see a need, just do it!

July Love Offering EnvelopeKATHRYN'S KLOSET!

Over the last three years St. Matthew's has participated in Diakon **Lutheran Social Ministries** Kathrvn's Kloset program out of Baltimore. We have assisted in sharing \$80,978.17 in 2010 and \$121.815.32 in 2011 worth of laundry detergent, fabric softener, cleaning supplies, and personal care items with the surrounding community and region. In that time period 10,301 (2010) and 21.613 (2011) individuals and 3,174 (2010) and 7,612 (2011) families have been supported in these difficult economic times. All of these products have been shared at no cost to any individual, group, or organization. We have partnered with churches, food banks, clothing giveaways, and community agencies in sharing these products. The costs involved are mainly for transporting the goods from Baltimore. MD back to our synod. There are also some fees per pound of goods received that our synod shares with Diakon for

warehousing costs in Baltimore.

We have received shipments of these goods here at our church to distribute to our community and for our own personal use. The money collected goes toward renting the truck and paying for gas to Baltimore MD and back to Selinsgrove.
