# The Ministry of Presence

When I am raised to life again, you will know that I am in my father, and you are in me, and I am in you. John 14:20

The Holy Spirit lives within you. God goes everywhere you do. What a gift! We are never alone, we are always with God! This is the ministry of presence. It's no longer just you, it's the Lord and you everywhere you go in life. You bring God to everyone you meet. We are empowered to share God's Love to others by just being there when needed. When I am with you I am joyous because we share in the family of believers. You have that impact on me every time we meet.

Bear one another's burdens. Galatians 6:2

Bad things happen to people we know and love. When they do, we are called to give the ministry of presence. We will do so even when we are scared, and filled with doubt. In those times, we must be honest. We can't pretend that the situation is not tragic. We cannot deny or marginalize the pain that is occurring. We don't have to have the answer to why is this happening. We just have to be there. To tell people that God Loves them, and so do you. That you and God will walk with them through this pain. That you and God will never leave them. That you will go through this together.

He was a few years older than me. His wife and I grew-up together. He worked with my dad. I was their wedding photographer. I took their youngest son hunting, and got him his first buck. Our lives were interwoven over many years. He died instantly in a farming accident. His oldest son grievously injured. I was stunned. I froze. I didn't know what to say or do. I could not bring myself to visit the family. I knew that the family would be surrounded with caring and loving neighbors. I waited. And waited. I could think of nothing to do. I Prayed and I wept. Prayed and wept some more.

After a few days his son was released from the ICU to a regular hospital room. My knees were weak as I walked into the hospital. As I approached the room, my mind was a complete blank. I was not alone. God was with me. He would speak for me. I entered the room. I had known him his whole life. I could barely recognize his swollen features. Upon seeing me with his one visible eye, he began to cry. The power of the ministry of presence. My voice creaked out the words "we Love you, and are Praying for you. I just wanted you to know. I won't hug you." If you saw what I saw you would know why. He cried as I left him. It was enough just to be there.

Mutual friends who are also farmers asked me "what do we say to them at the funeral? I told them "don't say anything, just hug them and tell them you Love them." These farmers, Bev and I arrived just before the public viewing. We waited just inside the doors of the funeral home. As the family entered, we hugged each one, and told them we Loved them. I gave each of them the Lord's Blessing. It seemed to work on this shell-shocked family.

You don't have to have all the answers. You don't have to have any answers. You don't have to recite appropriate scripture passages. You don't have to do anything. Just be there. You and God just have to be there. That's the ministry of presence.

#### A <u>Stewardship</u> Minute

The preface meditation that was printed in the bulletin for our Ash Wednesday worship service is better than anything I could have written for a Lenten stewardship meditation. With Pastor's permission, I am presenting that same meditation here.

#### Follow your treasure:

Matthew 6:21, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also," can be read as if it says that we should put our treasure where our heart already is. As the faithful, we often operate on this level. So once we get involved in church, then we increase our pledge. Or if we suddenly, in our heart, become more interested in feeding the poor, then the pocketbook comes out and we give more to ELCA World Hunger.

However, Jesus' teaching on this point is precisely the opposite. Jesus says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." So if you keep hoping your heart will be less attracted to material things or drawn deeper into a cause, then you need to start by putting your treasure where you want your heart to eventually wind up. Want to be more committed to your church? Increase your giving. Want to be more involved in advocacy for refugees and immigrants? Then donate time or money to the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service. Want to be less worried about your home and less invested in it? Then sell it and buy a less expensive house.

This insight applies at every level, all the way down. It's a guarantee that if we buy a new IPad, our heart will be in that IPad. We protect and value the things we have spent money on. So Jesus invites us to reprioritize by first putting our money where we want our hearts to be.

At the same time, we do well to remember Jesus' warnings in Matthew 6:1-6, against practicing our piety so that others will notice (and he specifically mentions alms giving). Our heart will follow our treasure, but where we put each is between us and God. During this season of Lent, where is the Spirit prompting you to redirect your treasure so that your heart may begin its Lenten journey?

# Simply Giving

Simply Giving—it works!

We now have several members using the Simply Giving program to automatically make donations to the church by electronic funds transfer. In fact, about 20% of our monthly financial stewardship is coming from that method of giving.

It is simple to do, and very convenient. All you need to do is complete a request form, available in the church or in the office, attach a voided check, and specify how much you want to give each month and where you want it to go: general fund, debt reduction, or synod benevolence. You can choose any one, two, or all three choices. On a regularly recurring date that you specify, money will automatically transfer from your account to the church's account. This will free you from writing checks, and hunting for envelopes, and allow you to be faithful in your stewardship, even when you are away. Also, don't worry about coming to church "empty handed". The ushers know that members donate through means other than the weekly offering plate, and will not judge you if you allow the plate to pass you by.

If you enroll, you will continue to receive envelopes in the mail. This will allow you, if you choose, to give additional money to our special offerings, such as the monthly *Love* Envelopes and our festival offerings such as Lent, Holy Week, and other special occasions.



Just use a blue pew envelope and mark what it is for and put it in the plate, you can mail it, drop it in the mail slot in the office door, or you can add it to your regular envelope and put it in the plate or mail—just be sure to write on what it is for on the envelope. 
