The Crucifer Ministry

The crucifer is the person who carries the processional cross to the altar during worship services. The lighting of the altar candles signifies the presence of God in the sanctuary. The presence of the processional cross signify the presence of Jesus in the sanctuary.

The cross is raised to its highest point at the beginning of the processional hymn. It is respectful at this time to turn and face the cross as it passes.

During the service the cross is placed at the altar. During the sending song at the end of the worship service, the crucifer lifts high the processional cross, and carries it to the rear of the sanctuary. It is respectful to turn and face the cross as it passes to the rear of the sanctuary. The cross remains held high until the altar candles have been extinguished.

With twenty minutes of orientation, you may serve as crucifer. Family members who have served have told me of feeling the presence of the Holy Spirit as they carried the cross. I, too, feel the same thing when I carry it. The crucifer ministry exists to honor and glorify God, and his son Jesus. Also to inspire and remind our family that Jesus is with us! Please serve God in this important ministry. Talk with Larry to volunteer.
