Monthly Financial Stewardship report for November, 2015

In 2015 we need to *average* **\$2,445** per week in giving to assure that we are able to meet all of our budgeted expenses. Our expense budget is something that we adopted and <u>committed</u> to.

Our weekly average church attendance during November was **59**.

Our total giving to the General Fund totaled \$10,229, an average of **\$2,046** per week.

Our year to date attendance was **3295** (**69**/week) and our year to date total giving was **\$106**,**638**, **(\$2,222**/ week.) We ended the month **\$10,722 behind** in the giving that we will need to meet our budgeted expenses.

Can each of us commit to being even more faithful in our attendance and intentional in our support? If you cannot attend as regularly as you'd like, please consider making regular contributions through the automatic *Simply Giving* program. Intentional regular giving through the *Simply Giving* program demonstrates your commitment and ongoing support of your church, even when you cannot attend services regularly. Symbols of Epiphany

Epiphany symbols generally relate either to the Wise Men or to the idea of the spreading of the Gospel. St. Matthew states that the Magi did not ao directly to Bethlehem but went first to Jerusalem where they inquired about the Messiah and were told that the prophets had spoken of Bethlehem. They proceeded there and found the mother and Child. The fivepointed star usually associated with the nativity is actually proper to Epiphany. It symbolized the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. The three chests reference the gifts presented to the Holy Child. The three crowns represent the Wise Men.
