A Note From Pastor Lois

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ;

We have arrived at Summer, school is almost over for this year, vacations are being planned, Knoebels is open, and after Pentecost Sunday, we will enjoy our Summer liturgical calendar which brings us Jesus' beautiful parables from the gospel of Matthew. We will enter the season of the Church Year, known as 'Time After Pentecost.'

I am wondering how people lived in 'Time before Pentecost', that is, people who lived before Christ. We only know and live life after Christ and the coming of the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the Resurrection of Christ and the giving of the gifts he bestowed upon us, the fruit of the Spirit. I have a 'sticky' on my computer reminding me of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, 'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Galatians 5. 22-23) And, in all this, we live and grow in wisdom of God's Spirit in our lives.

What are the ways of our wisdom? How have we learned and acted out of that knowledge and experience of living in the gifts of the Holy Spirit through our Baptism?

Congregation Council has had two Retreats with me in the past year and a half. They have mined scripture, they have wrestled with questions of Jesus such as 'Who do you say I am?'; 'What are you looking for?'; 'Do you want to be healed?'; 'What do you want me to do for you?'

A Note From Pastor Lois contintued

In our discussions following these Retreats and in going forward as the Board of Pine Street Evangelical Lutheran Church, the questions remain in place for the Council, and for every member. The Holy Spirit brings the fruits of the spirit to bear on the answers to these questions, the Holy Spirit guides us to wisdom along the way. The answers to these questions do not come quickly, but they do come. The answers create new questions such as: 'What are you looking for?'; 'What do you believe'; 'How do you know what you believe, what informs you?'; 'What changes you?'; 'How shall we go forward guided by the Holy Spirit with wisdom?'. We have arrived at a time to begin preparation for going forward with new pastoral leadership. The time frame has not been defined because there are many questions, much discernment. Those questions and discernment are built upon the work of Council and Ministries these past two years. Some may be tempted to push through this work quickly for the sake of 'getting it done', but that is ill-advised. The work of discernment always requires the commitment of time, beginning with a commitment of prayer from all who are involved, that is, from every member of this church.

Wisdom? The Holy Spirit brings wisdom to those who seek, who search, who dwell in God's Word. Setbacks and distractions keep us from moving forward. The questions remain: What is God Calling This Church to Do? How shall we Do It? What do we have to Do It with?

I pray you will make a commitment of time to be in prayer for this Church: for the Leaders of Council, The Officers of this Church, for the Members who have stepped up in new leadership this past year; for Wisdom to build this house with resolve to live in God's Dominion and to Worship our Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as fervently as if one's life depended on it, as it does.

"But this I say: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will reap bountifully. So, let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:6,7)

We continue to look at biblical references to stewardship. In this passage, Paul is exhorting the people of the early church in Corinth to be generous in support of the church.
