A Note From Pastor Lois

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

"Do you not know that you are God's temple, and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person, for God's temple is holy, and you are that temple." (1 Corinthians 3. 16-17)

On March 1, Ash Wednesday, we enter Lent, a time marked by the church for prayer, fasting and almsgiving, a time of penitence, reflection and meditation. The schedule for study and worship of this church family follows in this newsletter. The times for your personal reflection, meditation and prayer will be for your discernment.

I would like to remind all of us that God has called us to be holy, as God is holy, and that we are dwelling every day with God's Spirit in us. Lent offers a special time to be more intentional and attentive to our holiness as God is dwelling in us. The scripture readings from the Seventh Sunday after Epiphany are particularly inviting as they call us to remember who we are and to whom we belong. The readings from Leviticus 19 and Matthew 5 remind us how to be in relationship with one another and with God.

The usual 'what shall I give up for Lent' reminds me again that there are always opportunities to give up those things that keep us from the realization that we are called to be holy. Anything that one would not associate with the divine holy God would be a good thing to give up. Anything that takes away the focus on the goodness of God's Spirit within, anything that we allow to have priority before God is suspect. The only one who can assess the spiritual needs of one's own life is oneself and God. An inventory and honest evaluation of habits, actions, activities, will reveal where one can improve.

But the true question is how shall one make an honest quest this Lent to be more attentive to God, and the holy self, the goodness within, the Spirit of God that is with us now, and forever. This same Spirit calls us into relationship with one another and unites us forever in the holiness of the One God.

Lent is an opportunity for the family to be together, to study and to worship together midweek, and on Sundays. As we begin this Lenten season together, my prayer is for you, and a blessed acknowledgement of yourself as God knows you. May the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be in you now, and always.

Lent

Lent was first celebrated by the church as the final weeks of preparation of catechumens for their Baptism. Lent varied in length, but now is six weeks beginning on Ash Wednesday. (Sundays are not 'of Lent', but 'in Lent') The scripture readings these past weeks, both on Sundays and daily lessons, have stressed that we are to love God, and one another. Our love for God is reflected and shown in our relationships with each other. Therefore, as we enter Lent, let us come together, as the family of God, brothers and sisters, into worship before God.

This year, Wednesday Vespers will have scripture readings that illumine 'faith'. Scripture will be read and a brief meditation on the faith of: Noah, Abraham, Moses, the Israelites, Jesus the Perfecter of Our Faith. Sunday Mornings the scripture readings will focus on the gospels which stir in us crucial questions about our own faith. How shall we examine our own faith life, how shall we be 'self-suspicious'? The gospel readings will present for our discerning and spiritual perusal the account of Jesus in the wilderness being tempted by the devil;

Nicodemus who was afraid to come openly, in the light of day, to Jesus; The Samaritan woman who misunderstands, at first, the living water of Jesus; the blind man and his encounter with the questioning of the Pharisees; and finally the death of Lazarus, the dearly loved brother of Martha and Mary, friends of Jesus.

Each of these gospel accounts presents for us a time to ponder our own security and insecurities about our faith in Jesus the Christ. Each of these gospel accounts speaks to emotions and attitudes that we know and hold in tension with our witness of Jesus as the Christ. As we hear these gospel accounts, particularly in the gathered assembly of our brothers and sisters, we are called to wrestle with them, to know them, and to live into them, because they also name us, and our fears, and our struggles, on the way to the Resurrection.

We do not get to the Resurrection without going through Good Friday, and we come to Good Friday only after Ash Wednesday, the weeks of Lent, Palm Sunday, and Maundy Friday. Let us together, brothers and sisters, witness to the unconditional love of God in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, our Lord, our Christ.

Lent is an opportunity for the family to be together, to study and to worship together midweek, and on Sundays. Please see the schedule for times and dates of services.

The Nudge of the Holy Spirit

Have you ever felt that Spirit-led nudge that pulls you to talk or pray with a stranger about their spiritual life? This kind of nudge is more than an intuition. It's the voice of God inviting you to join Him in His redemptive work. It's God speaking to you through the Holy Spirit. I think it starts off as a feeling of "there is something to do, but I'm afraid of taking that step." "I'm not sure this is of the Lord, so I'll just go on with my life." This kind of nudge grows heavier. It is a sense of intense spiritual heaviness that God is underlining this person for you. The longer you reflect on it, that feeling moves to" I think I have to do something and I better do it now." The Spirit of God is inviting you to participate in the work of drawing a person to Jesus. You might call it prompting, a leading, a nudge, but it clearly seems to be "not you."


